The ASRU Workshop is a flagship event of IEEE Speech and Language Processing Technical Committee. The workshop is held every two years and has a tradition of bringing together researchers from academia and industry in an intimate and collegial setting to discuss problems of common interest in automatic speech recognition and understanding.

This year, we have an exciting line-up for the technical program. A total of 299 paper submissions were received and were 144 are accepted to be presented at the main conference. There are 5 keynote speeches and 5 invited talks ranging from characterizing charisma to the kinship between speech and music, and auditory scene analysis.
